At the Center’s Demonstration School, Educare of Miami-Dade, all practices are modeled by research and in depth observation of students without interrupting their learning process. The Center brings together leading child advocates and works with business leaders and lawmakers to raise the standards of early childhood education.

From 6 weeks old to 5 years of age, children can be enrolled at the Center. Besides the traditional curriculum for early child education, the school's programming includes exposure to a second language, the ecology and an anti-violence philosophy to teach children to solve their differences peacefully.
