

**SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO FY2008-2009  
ACTION PLAN RELATED TO THE USE OF  
NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (NSP) FUNDS**

Federal regulations governing the City of Miami 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan require that citizens be provided reasonable notice of and an opportunity to comment on any substantial amendment to the plan per 24CFR 91.105/115. The City of Miami was awarded \$12,063,702, as a result of the 2008 Housing and Economic Recovery Act (HERA), and proposes the following amendments to the FY-2008-2009 Action Plan in relation to NSP activities to be undertaken to benefit low-, moderate- and middle income residents.

**Activity/ Strategy**

1. Change in dollar allocations as follows: (i) Reduce Strategy A: Establish financing mechanisms for purchase and redevelopment of foreclosed upon homes and residential properties from \$2,100,000 to \$750,000 (ii) Increase Strategy E: Redevelopment of demolished or vacant properties from \$1,706,332 to \$3,056,332;
2. Inclusion of the NSP – Funded Rehabilitation Program under Strategy A: Establish financing mechanisms for purchase and redevelopment of foreclosed upon homes and residential properties;

Draft copies of the substantial amendment will be available for public comment and review for a period of no less than 15 days and may be obtained from the Department of Community Development at 444 SW 2 Avenue, 2 Floor, Miami, FL 33130 or on its website at <http://www.miamigov.com/communitydevelopment/pages/>. The review and comment period commences on Wednesday, March 24, 2010 and ends on Wednesday, April 7, 2010. Comments must be submitted in writing to: 444 SW 2 Avenue, 2 Floor, Miami, FL 33130 Attn. Roberto Tazoe and must be received no later than April 7, 2010. The substantial amendment will be presented to City commission for approval on Thursday, April 8, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. (public hearing). The meeting site is accessible to the handicapped.
